

# Hurricane Harvey

---

## Overall

- Precinct One has been very active in helping families and neighborhoods recover from the devastating impact of Hurricane Harvey.
- From rescuing families stranded in flooded homes to delivering supplies to staffing shelters to rebuilding infrastructure, we are doing all we can to help people during this time of great need.
- Currently, almost all of our community centers and parks are back to normal operations, although damages will keep some facilities closed temporarily until repairs are completed.
- We are actively repairing roads and clearing debris to help neighborhoods return to normal.

## Clean-up/Recovery

- \*\*\*Precinct One is working diligently to clean up debris from unincorporated precinct roadways. We have three crews stationed throughout the precinct working hard to help families clean up after one of the worst storms in our history.
- So far, Precinct One crews has made one full pass to every unincorporated home and have picked up around 120,000 cubic yards of debris.
- Our goal is to make two additional passes of every unincorporated homes before Thanksgiving to get all of the debris.
  
- Harris County is clearing debris from roadways as well as debris that has been removed from flooded homes.
- If you have debris from the storm, place it near the curb for pick-up. This includes yard waste and vegetation, electronics, appliances, furniture, and demolition debris.
- You should separate normal household trash and follow your normal trash removal schedule.
- At this time, trash collectors are not accepting Household Hazardous Waste such as paint, batteries and chemicals. There will be a separate collection for these items.
- Curbside recycling services are also suspended temporarily. Drop-off centers are still open.

### **FEMA/Flood insurance**

- If you flooded you may be entitled to FEMA Disaster Assistance. It starts with getting a FEMA number. To register call 1-800-621-FEMA (3362) or go online to [www.disasterassistance.gov/](http://www.disasterassistance.gov/)
- FEMA has extended the deadline for proof of loss from 60 days to 1 year, required insurers to issue payments as soon as possible, and make payments based on an adjuster's report without requiring proof of loss.
- Additionally, the Small Business Administration also offers low-interest loans to business owners, homeowners and renters recovering from Hurricane Harvey. You still must register with FEMA and more information can be found at: <https://www.disasterassistance.gov/>

### **\*\*\*Buyouts**

- The Harris County Flood Control District is accepting applications for its Voluntary Home Buyout program for those property owners that have experienced significant flooding.
- The program is voluntary, contingent on available funding and program requirements, and not a guarantee of purchase.
